

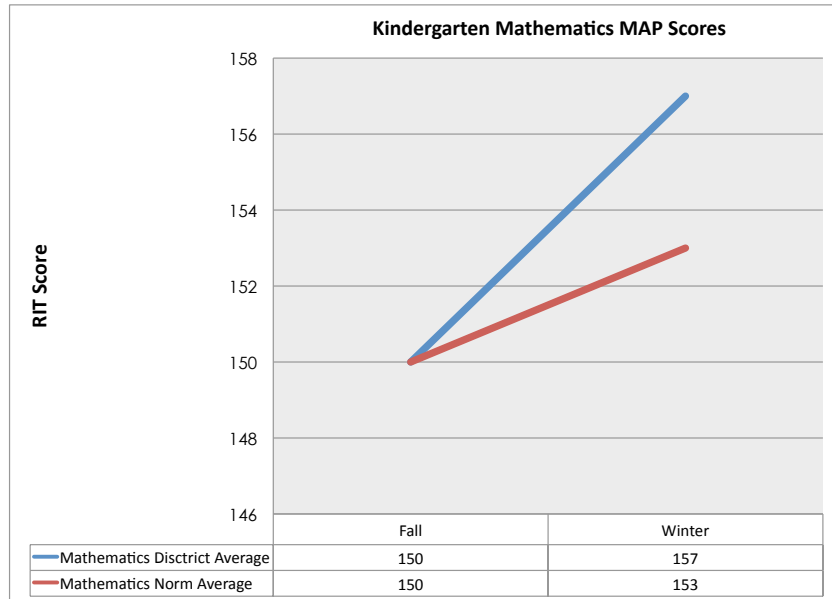
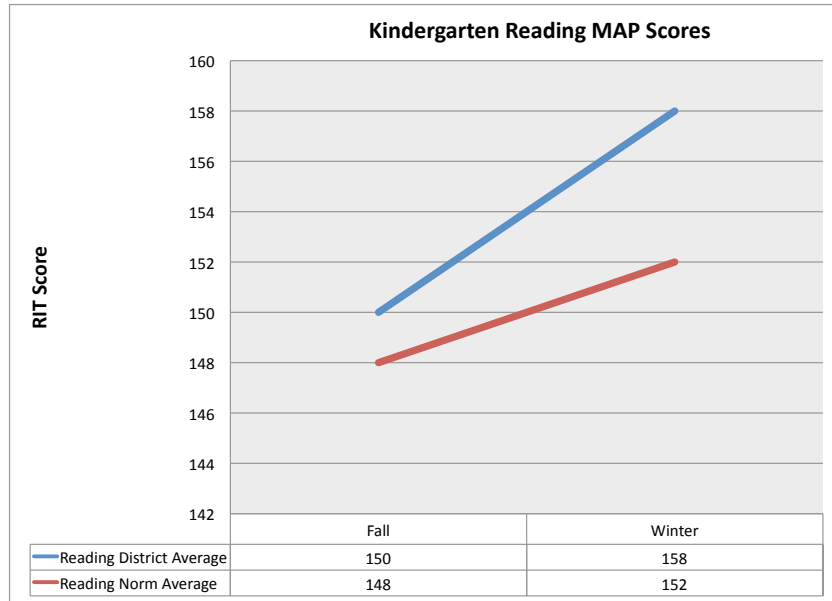


2010 - 2011 Mid-year MAP Growth Data

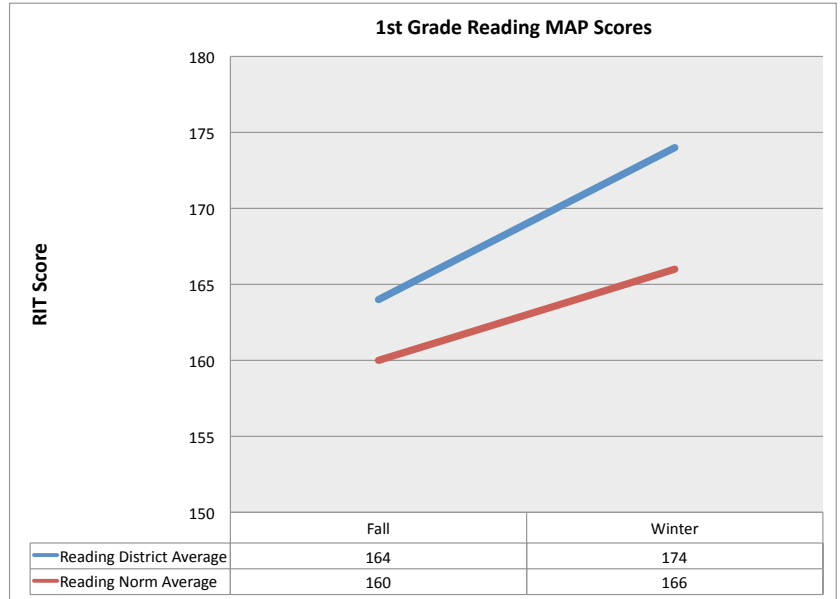
The Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) test assesses students based on their current skill level and provides an accurate indication of each student's instructional level. It gives teachers a guide to each student's existing skills and growth needs. MAP is a norm-referenced test, meaning it measures students' overall achievement and skill growth relative to the achievement and skill growth of students nationally (the norm), who are tested at the same point during the school year.

Students were tested in September and again in February. Students in Kindergarten through 2nd grade were tested in reading and mathematics and those in 3rd grade were tested in reading, mathematics and science.

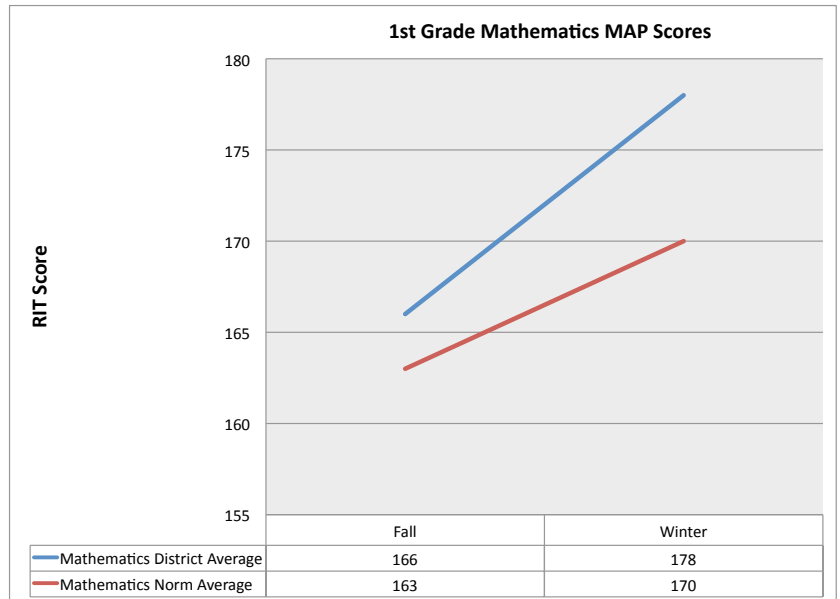
Kindergarten:



On average, kindergarten classes not only exceeded the norm growth rate in reading and math they actually doubled the norm's growth in reading.

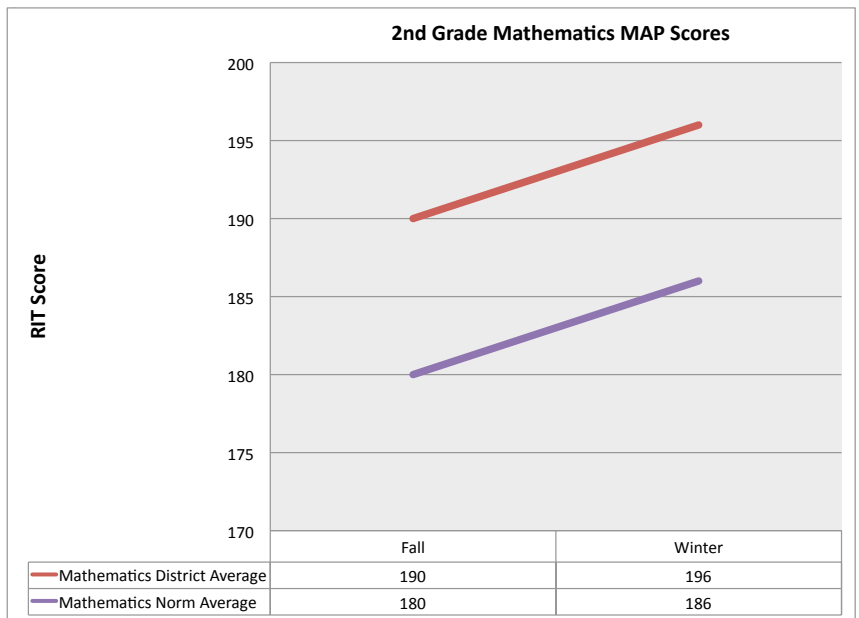
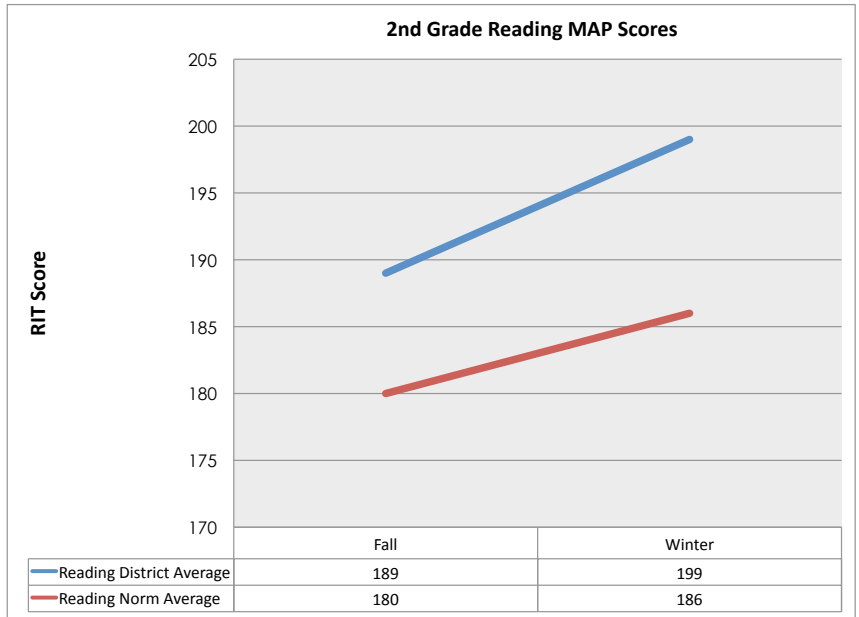


First Grade:

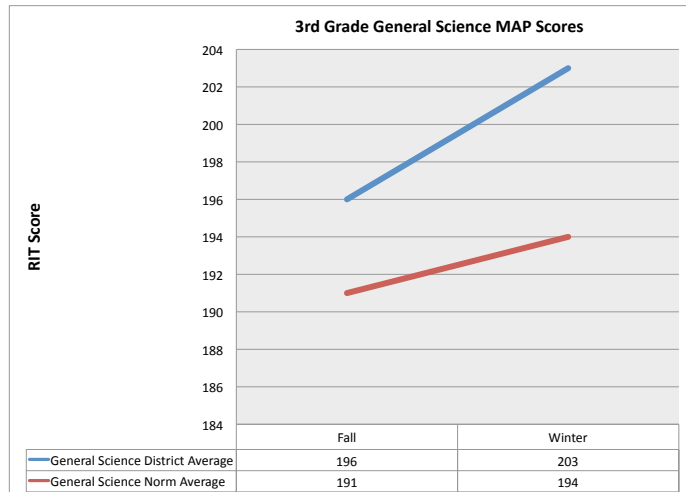
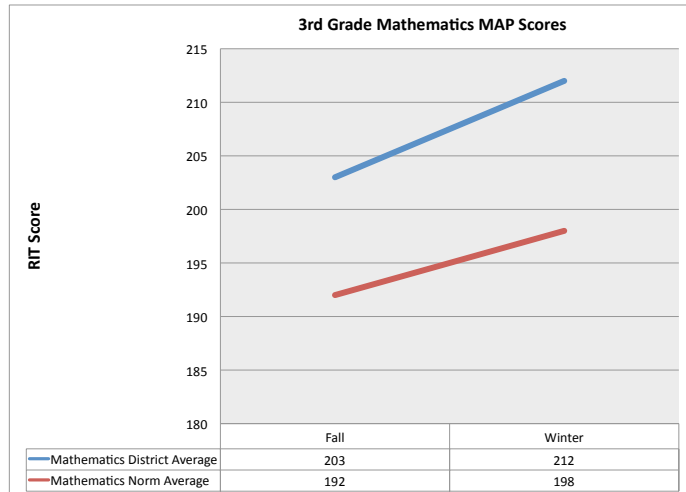
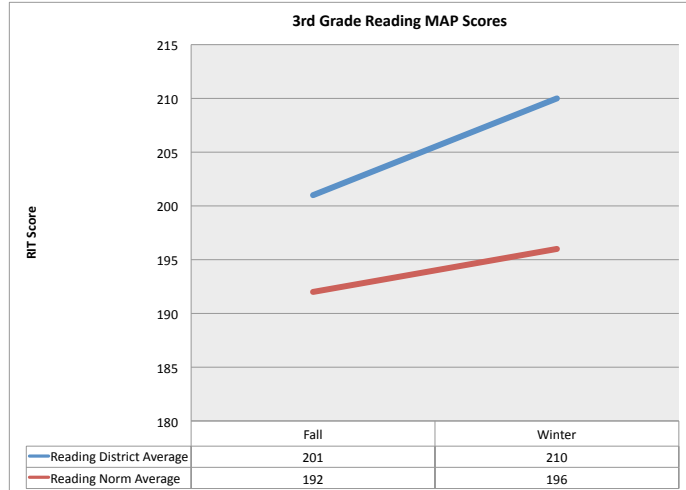


On average, 1st and 2nd grade classes in the area of reading exceeded the norm growth rate, nearly doubling it.

On average, 3rd grade students exceeded the norm growth rate significantly, doubling it in both reading and science.
